Subj: Undocumented arrival report on unidentified individual seeking refugee status
Status: Pending

Here within is a report on the validity of identification and application for asylum concerning *Mr. Erhood Stibber* (unverified).

Adm. L Simeon on the 7th March 2017 at 03h00, prevented an illegal vessel attempting to land illegally in Australia. *Mr. Erhood Stibber* was one of 182 people detained during a routine patrol as part of Operation Sovereign Borders.

Arrival Conditions:

- Individual part of group intercepted at 9°58'48.9"S 142°38'24.9"E on 07 March 2017 at 03:43^[1]
- Document holder is unaccompanied
- Migration path unknown
- Country of origin unknown

Identification Document Observations:

- Document does not have sufficient information to identify the holder, or issuer.
- Security measures in place cannot be verified as legitimate (watermark, perforated characters, rubber stamp)
- Document has not been translated (identified language : Hebrew). Document holder has not employed the free document translation service^[2]
- Previous travel destinations undocumented

Document Holder Intent:

Document holder is seeking refugee status under a Refugee visa (subclass 200).

Visa Application Eligibility:

Applicant is claiming refugee status under the eligibility of being subject persecution in their home country.

Applicant has sufficient financial wherewithal for application.

Applicant did not apply before arriving in chosen country of refuge

Course of Action:

Document holder has been detained until identity and origin can be identified and verified.

Further processing needs to be conducted to determine eligibility for refugee status.

In the event that the document be found to be fraudulent the application for a Refugee visa (subclass 200) will be nullified. In accordance with PIC 4020^[3] the document holder (and any associated family) may be prevented from being granted refugee status for up to three years.

Subject is currently being held for processing on Manus Island Immigration Processing Facility. Duration of detention subject to the time required to verify *Mr Stibber's* identity status.
