


ACTA IS A THREAT TO FUNDAMENTAL RIGHTS AND **ACCESS TO** KNOWLEDGE



This Anti-Counterfeiting Trade Agreement, negotiated in secret, would:

- turn Internet operators into a private copyright police.
- impose harsh and unfair penalties on users and consumers.
- harm access to medicines and to essential knowledge in poor


End to End Principle

We Are Changing The License

OpenStreetMap creates and provides free geographic data such as street maps to anyone who wants them. The project was started because most maps you think of as free actually have legal or technical restrictions on their use, holding back people from using them in creative, productive, or unexpected ways.


OpenStreetMap is asking existing contributors to re-license their contributions under the Open Database License 1.0 년. For those not familiar, this page explains the basic reasons and provides links to further resources with more detail.

What Are The Choices?

You can see the final draft of the page you will be presented with [here]

You have three choices.

- Agree You agree to the new OpenStreetMap Contributor Terms, (full text, human readable) including re-licensing your contributions under the ODbL. Anything that you have contributed in the past will be available forever under CC-BY-SA. This includes anything you contribute from now until the license change-over actually happens ... this needs a critical mass of folks agreeing. From the change-over the database with new contributions you make will be available under ODbL. Read on to find out about the differences between the current and new license.
- Agree, and I consider my contributions Public Domain Legally, this is the same as Agree. But it shows that you would
 prefer a simple license that just makes the data available to everyone without any restrictions at all. This will help define
 the future direction of OpenStreetMan.
